


Legacies of the Games



- Bring communities together a celebration of 41 hometown crowds
- Build volunteer capacity
 - 23,000 volunteers
- Boost for the economy
 - 26,000 new jobs
 - \$674 million in TO2015 venue projects
- Sport Legacy Fund
- Canadian athletes, hometown exposure



CIBC Pan Am/ Parapan Am Aquatics Centre and Field House



- Sports
 - Diving
 - Fencing
 - Modern pentathlon
 - Roller sports speed skating
 - Swimming (Pan/Parapan Am)
 - Synchronized swimming
 - Sitting volleyball
- The largest sport new-build for the Games and the largest investment ever in Canadian amateur sport history
- Legacy build for the University of Toronto, Scarborough




Cisco Milton Pan Am/Parapan Am Velodrome



- Sport
 - Track cycling
- Sole facility of its kind in Canada
- More than 120 top track cyclists (Pan am and Parapan Am) will compete for gold here
- Will house offices for Cycling Canada and Cycling Ontario



CIBC Pan Am / Parapan Am Athletics Stadium



- Sport
 - Athletics
- Will have a 400-metre track and an infield that supports throwing and jumping disciplines
- The stadium will be used after the Games for York University athletics and recreation training and events



CIBC Pan Am/Parapan Am Athletes' Village




- The Village will be the Gamestime home for 10,000 athletes, coaches and team officials
- Located on an 80-acre site next to the Don River in Toronto's waterfront district
- Legacy for the community as a mixed-use neighborhood





What will it feel like at Games time?

The Competitions



- 51 sports, 68 disciplines, 825 events
- 19 Olympic qualifiers for Rio 2016
- All 15 Parapan sports will be Paralympic qualifiers for Rio 2016
- Sport debuts:
 - Golf
 - Women's rugby sevens
 - Canoe/kayak slalom
 - Women's baseball
 - Men's softball (returning)
 - Wheelchair rugby
 - Women's sitting volleyball
 - Football 7-a-side




The Ceremonies
